Outstanding Facilities

The Horder Centre is located in beautiful, tranquil grounds on the edge of the stunning Ashdown Forest, yet within easy reach of the region's main towns and villages. It is home to state-of-the-art medical facilities, including the latest robotic surgical technology, one of UK's largest teams of specialist orthopaedic surgeons, and patient care and visitor amenities that ensure your treatment experience is as comfortable as possible.

Consultation Rooms

We have six outpatient consultation rooms and five outpatient therapy consulting rooms for access to individual physiotherapy/osteopathy and other musculoskeletal services.

Operating theatres

Our three state-of-the-art operating theatres are equipped with laminar flow and have suitable space and facilities to support a wide range of surgical procedures. We also have our own instrument decontamination facilities on site.

Outpatient gym

Our outpatient gym provides state of the art fitness equipment and a tranquil space for classes which include Pilates, HIIT 50 and Balance and Flexibility.

Diagnostic suite

Our diagnostic suite provides access to radiology services including x-rays, ultrasound and MRI scanning.

Knees



ACL reconstruction

Knee injuries commonly occur for those involved in sports but can also happen if your leg or knee becomes twisted. If your knee continually gives way after an accident or injury, it could be a sign that your anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) has ruptured – meaning a significant tear to the ligament that joins your thigh bone and knee joint. ACL reconstruction offers the chance of improving the stability of your knee in everyday life and sporting activities. The procedure is usually performed by an arthroscopy (keyhole surgery), using a camera to see inside your knee, and typically takes an hour to 90 minutes.

Meniscus tear

The medial meniscus is a c-shaped cartilage in between the bones of the knee joint that acts as a cushion between the thighbone and shinbone. Tears can result from a sudden twist in your knee, heavy lifting, or general wear and tear as we age. Symptoms may include pain when you rotate or twist your knee, swelling, instability.

Knee replacement

A total knee replacement is a surgical procedure to resurface the knee joint with artificial parts. This provides improved stability and mobility and helps to alleviate pain you may have experienced as a result of worn cartilage in the knee, from osteoarthritis or a previous injury.

We offer the latest robotic technology and injectable techniques for knees

ROSA, the latest robotic surgical technology

As one of the UK's leading hospitals for knee replacement surgery, we have access to the latest Robotic Surgical Assistant (ROSA) technology. Whilst the procedure is broadly similar to traditional knee replacement surgery, it is performed with the help of a robotic assistant. This is simply an additional tool to guide your surgeon, who still carries out the entire procedure.

The ROSA system uses a series of X-rays to generate 3D images of your unique knee anatomy that enable the surgeon to design a personalised plan prior to performing surgery. It uses a camera and optical trackers attached to your leg, to provide real time information about the precise position of the knee during surgery and makes adjustments even with the slightest movement of your legs. This ensures the surgical plan designed by your surgeon is carried out without any changes and with a high degree of precision.

In addition to helping surgeons place knee implants with greater precision, use of ROSA technology offers a number of additional benefits:

- **Reduced injury to adjacent tissues**
- **Increased longevity of the implant**
- **Smaller incisions with reduced scarring and minimal blood loss**
- **Less post-operative pain**
- **Shorter hospital stay and recovery period**
- **Quicker return to daily activities**
- **Lower incidence of complications**



We will need to determine if the ROSA Knee system is right for you, as the procedure typically takes longer than traditional surgery, and your surgeon will recommend if it is an option for you. ROSA based surgery is available to self-pay patients and through some insurance companies, so you will need to check with your insurance provider to see if they would specifically cover the ROSA procedure.

Arthrosamid® Injections

This is an innovative hydrogel-based injectable treatment that is ideal for individuals suffering from mild to moderate knee osteoarthritis (OA). It provides long-lasting relief in knee OA pain and discomfort, enabling patients to enjoy an improved quality of life without the need for surgery.

Once administered into the knee joint, it acts as a cushion, reducing friction and inflammation. The hydrogel integrates with the joint tissues, providing consistent pain relief and improving joint functionality over time.

A consultation with a specialist will determine if Arthrosamid® is the right choice. The treatment itself is administered through a single injection under local anaesthesia.

Raising the barre: dancing again after knee replacement surgery

Discipline, mobility and alignment are just some of the myriad skills required as a ballet dancer. But what happens when chronic knee pain starts to limit your movement, threatening your ability to perform?



Sitting on the sidelines was never going to be an option for retired professional ballet dancer Chris Howes-Burrows. As a dancer, he was no stranger to managing pain from injuries and intense routines, but the general wear and tear on his knee over the years led to pain that required expert attention.

Chris, 62, from Wadhurst, first saw Orthopaedic Surgeon Andrew Armitage around 12

years ago, when a knee arthroscopy at The Horder Centre showed the knee had bone-on-bone arthritis. Over the years, steroid injections were administered to ease the pain.

"Andrew is a brilliant surgeon and recognised when the time was right for me to have surgery. It is really important to listen to what you are told and to act on it."

"It got to the point where I wasn't walking at all because I was reserving myself for dancing. The turning point was during a ballet class and not being able to perform a full plié."

Chris' knee replacement took place in September 2023. He stayed in the hospital for two nights and attended the group exercise sessions which are crucial for the physiotherapists to measure the bend in your knee and show you the exercises that need to be completed during your recovery at home.

Chris' active lifestyle contributed to a quick and successful recovery. After 10 days he

started to use just one crutch and within a couple of weeks he was exercising in the gym.



Mr Armitage said: "Knee replacement surgery for severe arthritis can be very successful at improving a patient's quality of life and ability to function on a daily basis. A key decision is when to have the surgery. Recently it became evident Chris would benefit from a knee replacement. We are all pleased with his excellent progress and outcome."

Hip & Lower Back

Lower back surgery

Lower back surgery treatments are designed to address different conditions that affect the lumbar spine, to relieve pain, restore function, and improve the overall quality of life for patients suffering from chronic back issues. The procedure will depend on the patient's condition but typically lumbar decompression surgery involves removal of portions of bone and soft tissue to relieve pressure on the spinal cord or nerves in the lower back.

Hip replacement

Over time, your hip joint can become damaged due to wear and tear as we get older, arthritic conditions or injury. If so, you may be referred for a total hip replacement, a surgical procedure to replace the joint. During the operation, the two parts of your hip joint are removed and replaced with smooth artificial surfaces. These artificial pieces (the prosthesis) are implanted into healthy portions of the pelvis and thigh bone. The hip replacement operation usually takes an hour to 90 minutes.

Hip revision

Hip revision surgery may be needed for people who have previously undergone a hip replacement procedure. The procedure is required because after 10-15 years the implanted artificial joint may no longer fit correctly. The original prosthesis is removed and replaced with a new one. Sometimes this is a long process involving more than one surgical procedure and is certainly more taxing than the original replacement surgery.

After several years of trying to manage hip pain through physiotherapy exercises and pain relief injections, Thelma McGough underwent hip replacement surgery that provided rapid results

Talking about her pre surgery symptoms, Thelma, 83, said: "I have a really high pain threshold, but there were times I was in tears. I could barely walk and had to use a stick. My leg would often give way. When pain is continuous, it is not only limiting but it has a very wearing effect on your outlook on life."

After a visit to her GP she was referred to an advanced practitioner. Exercise and then steroid injections failed to provide pain relief. A second referral to an Advanced Practitioner at The Horder Centre resulted in an immediate X-ray and a

consultation with Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon Mr Senthil Velayudham.

"During the consultation, he discussed all the processes I had already undergone. Mr Velayudham saw the X-ray results, recognised the need for a hip replacement and said it



could be done. The timescale was significantly shorter than I expected."

Thelma's hip replacement surgery was in January 2024 and she spent three days at The Horder Centre to recover before being discharged.

"I was in and out very quickly and had no complications," said Thelma. "I was given medication to take home and provided with a booklet of exercises, which I followed. One exercise, I was unable to do at

first but Mr Velayudham advised me to just do what I could and said it would eventually happen. Now, I can easily do that exercise."

"Within five to six weeks I was driving again - not driving during that time was hard."

"The operation was transformative.

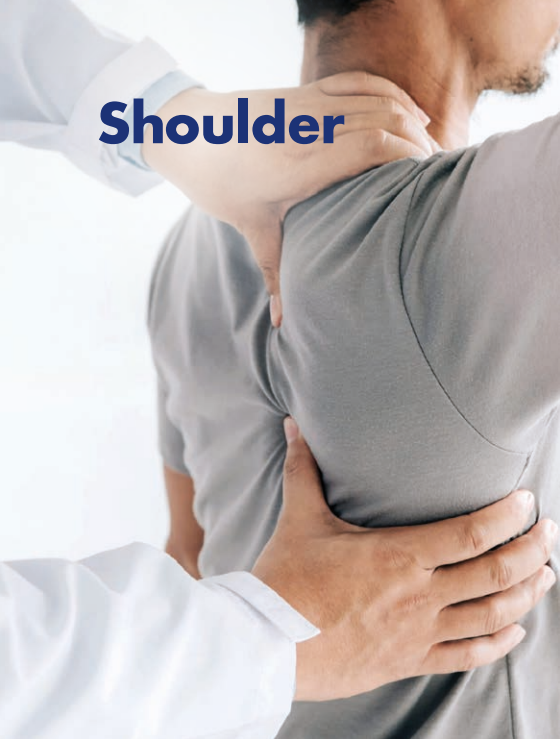
Within two months, I was fine. To not have pain is miraculous. It's a game changer."

Shoulder



Rotator cuff

The rotator cuff is formed from four muscles and tendons that attach your arm to the top of your shoulder blade. Impingement or a tear are the usual types of damage that can happen to the rotator cuff. Rotator-cuff problems can cause pain and weakness in your shoulder. Surgery can help to reduce any pain and to get back some strength in your shoulder.

Shoulder arthroscopy

A shoulder arthroscopy is keyhole shoulder surgery that allows your surgeon to investigate or treat issues and pain inside the shoulder joint without the need to fully open it up. A thin tube with a camera is inserted through small incisions in your skin around the shoulder joint, allowing your surgeon to identify what is causing you pain. They should usually be able to treat some problems within the joint at the same time, such as repairing or removing torn tissue with surgical instruments.

Shoulder replacement

A shoulder replacement involves replacing the shoulder joint if it has been damaged by injury or worn away by arthritis. When arthritis affects the shoulder it causes the lining of these joint surfaces to wear, causing pain and stiffness. During a shoulder replacement, both the head of the humerus and the socket are replaced with artificial surfaces. Artificial shoulder parts are usually made of metal or plastic, or a combination of these. The operation usually takes 1 to 2 hours.

The Horder Centre helps windsurfing instructor Pierre get back out on the sea



A DIY accident in July last year saw windsurfing instructor Pierre Leroy fall five feet through wooden decking, damaging his ribs and shoulder, and leaving him in extreme pain.

A visit to A&E confirmed shoulder tissue damage and after a further check, he was told that the injury would take around twelve weeks to heal.

After three months of persistent pain Pierre contacted his GP who arranged an MRI scan at The Horder Centre. This revealed a tear in the supraspinatus muscle, requiring surgery.

Pierre, 65, from Hildenborough explained: "The GP sent the referral form to the NHS and I received an appointment but was advised it would be three more months before I could have the operation. I couldn't wait that long so decided to go privately at The Horder Centre."

Pierre saw Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon, Mr Per Anderberg, who confirmed

following an X Ray that Pierre needed rotator cuff surgery. Just 6 weeks later surgery was carried out, including shaving of the acromioclavicular (AC) joint to reduce pressure on the rotator cuff. Surgery was performed in the morning under general anaesthetic, and Pierre was ready to go home by 4.35pm.

"I had to wear a sling day and night for six weeks. My stitches were removed after two weeks and I had physiotherapy at The Horder Centre after four weeks, and again

at six weeks, when I also saw Mr Anderberg for a check-up.

"Everybody was pleased with the progress and two months after his operation, Pierre is continuing to make good progress and looking forward to a summer back out windsurfing.

"My aim was to not to miss another summer season, and thanks to my prompt treatment at The Horder Centre this is going to be possible".

"Everybody is treated as an individual; you are not just a number."

Hand and Wrist



Carpal tunnel syndrome

Carpal tunnel syndrome is a condition where there is increased pressure on a nerve that crosses the front of your wrist (the median nerve). The median nerve runs through a tight tunnel, together with the tendons that bend your fingers. If the tunnel becomes too tight it can cause pressure on the nerve, usually resulting in pain or numbness in the thumb, index and middle fingers. Carpal tunnel release is usually performed under a local anaesthetic and takes about 20 minutes. You should be able to go home the same day.

Dupuytren's

Dupuytren's contracture affects the palmar fascia (a cord of fibrous tissue) in your palm and fingers, causing the fascia to thicken and shorten. Knots of scar-like tissue form under your skin over time, pulling your fingers towards your palm. Dupuytren's contracture generally affects your ring and little finger, but you can have it in both hands. It can take months or years for your condition to become severe enough to require treatment. We do not recommend treatment if your condition is in its early stages. No one can cure Dupuytren's contracture, but surgery can relieve your symptoms.

Trapeziectomy

Arthritis around the base of the thumb is usually due to everyday wear and tear and can cause pain, stiffness and deformity in the thumb. Trapeziectomy surgery involves removing a small bone (one of eight which form the wrist) called the trapezium. This is situated at the base of the thumb. This provides more space for the thumb to move so that the arthritic bone surfaces are not rubbing together causing pain. The operation will usually involve you coming in hospital for a day.

Foot and Ankle



Bunion surgery

A bunion is a bony lump on the side of the foot at the base of the big toe. The most common cause of bunions is footwear that does not have enough width to fit the toes in their natural position. They are occasionally associated with arthritis of the joint at the base of the big toe.

The operation may involve removing the bunion, releasing or tightening ligaments, realigning your big toe, stiffening a joint and straightening your smaller toes.

The operation usually takes 30 minutes to an hour and you should be able to go home the same day or the day after.

Ankle arthrodesis

If you have severe arthritis in your ankle, an ankle arthrodesis should reduce your pain and allow you to do more of your normal activities. Your surgeon will remove the damaged joint surfaces. They will then fix the bones together with a metal plate, a metal rod, or screws. The operation usually takes between an hour and an hour and a half. You should be able to go home after one to three days.

Classes are led by expert instructors and are dedicated to helping you achieve your fitness goals, with a special focus on enhancing mobility, flexibility, and overall well-being.

Balance & Flexibility

This class is aimed at people who are over 60 and afraid of falling, or who have had one of two falls. It is for those who want to improve their strength, balance and, confidence in performing daily activities, mobility and independence, with a guided exercise programme.
